






METABOLIC RISK FACTORS FOR DIET-RELATED NONCOMMUNICABLE DISEASES, 2008 (%)








POPULATION DENSITY OF HEALTH WORKERS PER 1,000 PEOPLE




FEMALE SECONDARY EDUCATION ENROLLMENT (%)


